

Prerequisites For Esthetician Training

Enrollment is open to the following:

Estheticians: licensed or completed a recognized program in Esthetics; Licensed or Certified Health Care Practitioners: MD, PT, PTA*, OT, OTA*, RN, MT (see below), DC, DO, DDS, ND, Physician's Assistant, CMT, RMT, LMT, etc. For Massage Therapists: A minimum of 500 hours curriculum of a massage therapy school or successful completion of a US National Certification (such as NCTMB, BCTMB, CMT) is required.

BASIC COURSES FOR ESTHETICIANS - are open to:

Estheticians who are licensed to practice in their state or province and/or have completed a recognized program in Esthetics are qualified to take a:

3-Day (or 2.5-Day) Basic Neck & Face course (A)

and/or a

5-Day Basic Body course (C)

ADVANCED COURSES FOR ESTHETICIANS - are open to:

Estheticians who have satisfactorily completed the 3-Day (or 2.5-Day) Basic Neck & Face **(A)** *or* have completed the 5-Day Basic Body course **(C)** are qualified to take the:

3-Day (or 2.5-Day) Advanced Neck and Face course (B)

Estheticians who have completed the 5-Day Basic Body course **(C)** are qualified to take the:

5-Day Advanced Body course (D)

SEQUENCE OF TRAINING CHOICES:

USUAL COURSE OF STUDY:

3-Day Basic Neck & Face course >then> **3-Day Advanced** Neck and Face course >then> **5-Day Basic** Body course >then> **5-Day Advanced** Body course.

1 ALTERNATE COURSE OF STUDY:

5-Day Basic Body course >then> **3-Day Advanced** Neck and Face course >then> **5-Day Advanced** Body course. (This skips the **3-Day Basic** Neck & Face course, and is thus more demanding on the student.)

CONSTRAINTS - Additional Information:

Each **Basic** Course student will be required to sign an agreement neither to teach MLD nor to use MLD as Therapy.

Each **Advanced** course student will be required to sign an agreement to apply MLD only within the professional practice acts of her/his state or province.

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
